

Kirkkopulletiini OF FINNISH LUTHERAN CHURCH Maaliskuu March – Huhtikuu April 2024

Olemme keskellä paaston aikaa, joka valmistaa meitä pääsiäiseen, Jeesuksen ylösnousemusjuhlaan. Puhe ylösnousemuksesta saattaa hämmentää monia, koska siihen littyy evankeliumeiden mukaan järjelle käsittämättömiä asioita, kuten enkeleitä, suuren kiven ihmeellinen vieritys, Jeesuksen ilmestymisiä ystävilleen ja viimein taivaaseen astuminen. Jos yrittää kaikkea tuota ymmärtää tai kovin syvällisesti tutkia, joutuu helposti sivupolulle.

Kannattaa muistaa, että osa Raamatun teksteistä on kirjoitettu ymmärrettäväksi metaforisesti. Ja kannatta myös muistaa, että metaforinen tulkinta on paljon syvempää kuin kirjaimellinen tulkinta.

Apostolien teoista voimme lukea, että Jeesus ilmestyi kuolemansa jälkeen ystävilleen 40 päivän ajan. Nämä ilmestykset synnyttivät kristinuskon. Jeesuksen ystävät tulivat vakuuttuneiksi, että Jeesus ei jäänytkään kuoleman valtakuntaan, vaan elää.

Jeesuksen ystävät eivät olleet mitään super uskovaisia, vaan tavallisia ihmisiä, jotka joutuivat kamppailemaan elämän ja olosuhteiden tuomien haasteiden kanssa siitä huolimatta, että olivat seuranneet Jeesusta. Heikkoina ja haavoittuvaisina.

Kuitenkin he olivat varmoja, että Jumalan voima oli Jeesuksessa ja nyt saman voiman vaikutuksesta kuolema ei voinut pitää Jeesusta.

Apostolien teoista myös voimme lukea kuinka Jeesus siirtyi viimein toiseen todellisuuteen, joka on meidän aistiemme ulottumattomuuksissa.

Kristinuskossa me luotamme, että koska Jeesus on ylösnoussut kuolemasta Jumalan voimasta, myös me ylösnousemme. Mutta siitä, mitä kuoleman jälkeen tapahtuu, kukaan ei voi sanoa varmuudella mitään. Me kaikki olemme osa Jumalan suurta kertomusta. Siinä kertomuksessa olemme Jumalan suuren armon varassa.

Emeritus piispa Wille Riekkinen sanoo että hänellä on sellainen tunne, että kuoleman rajan tuolla puolen on jotain enemmän, kuin me osaamme ajatella – on toinen todellisuus.

Häntä on puhutellut suomalaisen taitelija Helene Schjerfbeckin maalaus *Ovi*, jossa on kappelin tumma ovi. Oven ja oviaukon välissä on rakoja, joista säteilee kirkas valo.

Sitä valoa piispa Riekkinen luonnehtii tuonpuoleiseksi.

Se valo antaa meille toivoa jo nyt, ja siksi voimme keskittyä siihen, miten voimme parhaiten elää täällä kristittyinä. Rakastaen, palvellen, tarvitsevan vierellä kulkien.

Pastori Nina

We are in the midst of Lent, which prepares us for Easter, the celebration of Jesus' resurrection. The thought of resurrection may confuse many because, according to the Gospels, it involves things incomprehensible to reason, such as angels, the miraculous rolling of a great stone, the revelations of Jesus to his friends, and finally the ascension into heaven.

If you try to understand all of that or study it very deeply, you can easily get sidetracked. It is worth remembering that some Bible texts are written to be understood metaphorically. And it's also worth remembering that metaphorical interpretation is much deeper than literal interpretation.

In the book of Acts, we read that Jesus appeared to his friends for 40 days after his death. These apparitions gave birth to Christianity. Jesus' friends became convinced that Jesus did not remain in the realm of death, but lives.

Jesus' friends were not super believers, but ordinary people who struggled with the challenges and circumstances of life despite having followed Jesus. They were as weak and vulnerable as anybody else. However, they were sure that God's power was in Jesus and now, under the influence of the same power, death could not hold Jesus.

In the book of Acts, we can also read how Jesus finally moved into another reality that is beyond our senses. In Christianity, we trust that since Jesus was resurrected from death by the power of God, we too will be resurrected. But about what happens after death, no one can say anything with certainty. We are all part of God's great story. In that story, we live by God's great grace.

Bishop Emeritus Wille Riekkinen says that he has the feeling that there is something more beyond death than we can think of – another reality.

He has been impressed by Finnish artist Helene Schjerfbeck's painting *The Door* that depicts the Dark Door of a Chapel. There are gaps between the door and the doorway, from which a bright light is emitted. Bishop Riekkinen describes that light as the afterlife.

That light already gives us hope, and therefore we can focus on how we can best live here as Christians. Loving, serving, walking beside the needy.

The year 2024 started out with the unfortunate news of extensive water damage in the downstairs area of the FLC building. The Council and the Building Committee have been busy coordinating the remediation and rebuilding activities, as well as addressing insurance coverage for the damage. Work is now well under way to restore the downstairs to a fully usable condition.

The other project of high importance has been arrangements for a successor for Pastor Nina. The Call Committee appointed by the Council has been working with Pastor Marita Toivonen on employment terms and a visa application. The Council is hoping to have an agreement in place soon and a visa application submitted shortly after that.

Despite being very busy with water damage remediation activities, the Building Committee has also acted in terms of removing the railing from the altar area. As a result, there is now more space for choir performances and other activities in that part of the sanctuary.
